

HOW TO PAINT




WHAT WILL YOU NEED?

A Canvas, Paints in the color, Purple, Yellow, Blue, Green, Black, Red, Orange, and White, Paint Brushes, Cup of water, Paper Towels, Something to hold your paint on. (Such as, a paper plate, cardboard, plastic lids, or whatever your parents say you can use.)



THINGS TO REMEMBER!!

Wear something your parents don't mind you getting paint on. Put some kind of tablecloth under the canvas you are going to paint. Have a parent or someone nearby who can help you if you need it.



WHAT DO I DO NOW??

Step 1: Draw the picture you are going to paint on the canvas. To make sure that is how you want it.

Next paint the background. The colors you will need are yellow and orange. Mix the two colors together but do not mix too much because then you are wasting paint. Paint the yellow and orange mix in the background area.

(Don't forget to use the cup of water to rinse off your paint brush for your next color, and



use the paper towel to dry it off a little bit.)

Step 2: You will be going to the middle of the flower. The colors you will need are yellow, green, and black. Outline the middle of the flower with black then mix your yellow and green together and go from the very middle of the flower towards the black line you just painted. Let it slowly fade into a more yellow only color.



Step 3: We will be painting the pedals. The colors you will need for these are purple, white, and blue. You can mix black and blue, White and Blue, purple and white. But keep a little separate in case you do not need a color mix. The tips are a pretty dark blue and the further in it goes in towards the black line it is more of a purple color. Feel free to make it how you want it.

Step 4: For the last step we are going to paint the ladybug. The only two colors you will need are red and black. Do not want to mix these two colors together for this one. First you want to start with the red and color the body of the bug and then use the black for the spots, the head and the antenna.
